Inspection Report:

On Wednesday, February 28, I was tasked with inspecting the proposed marijuana caregiver storefront at 50 Birchwood Lane to ensure that landscaping, lighting, and access management were completed per the Planning Board permit. Inspections were performed on February 29, March 1, and March 6.

<u>Landscaping/Buffering</u>: In addition to the existing landscaping on-site, the applicants proposed an eight-foot-tall fence, juniper and holly trees, flowering plants, herbs, and stone accents. Current landscaping is minimal due to the time of year and the presence of deciduous plants but is otherwise in-line with what was approved by the Board. Grass is present and interspersed between other plantings and features. According to the applicant, this grass can grow to approximately 6 feet tall during the summer. Evergreen plantings are small or immature, except for two that are located at the stone wall in front of the farm stand (*Fig. 2, 3*).

<u>Lighting</u>: Applicants proposed two LED porch lights and two LED security lights on the building. Both sets of lights are installed and face southward, away from the private roadway, as per the approved Planning Board permit. A digital light meter was used to record the illuminance of the LED porch lights on Thursday, February 29, at approximately 7:15 PM. These lights produced 0.31 footcandles at the base of the south-facing porch, and 0.00 footcandles at the property line.

A second inspection was conducted on Wednesday, March 7, at approximately 7:00 PM. Two readings were taken at the porch, with readings of 15.5 and 16.7 footcandles. Three readings were taken on the road, reading 0.00 footcandles at the entrance, 0.00 footcandles behind the farmstand, and 0.01 at the exit.

Illumination from the farmstand did not produce undue glare and was lower than that of the ambient neighborhood residential lighting, which is not regulated by the Land Use Ordinance. Illumination from businesses must not exceed 0.50 footcandles at the property line, per Article 10.D.6.d. of the Land Use Ordinance.

Access Management: The Planning Board permit states that "[t]he applicant is proposing to upgrade the road to be 18-feet wide with 2-foot shoulders. All work to widen the road should be on the south side of the road, or before any work is done on the north side of the road, the property pins must be located."

The roadwork was undertaken and completed by Tourtelotte Excavation. On September 3, 2020, CEO Carey issued a Stop Work Order which alleged that modifications had been made to the north side of the road prior to the property pins being located. This Stop Work Order was removed on September 10, 2020. According to CEO Carey, the road was approved, and the Conditions of Approval had been met.




Figure 1: Culvert near 9 Birchwood Lane. Slight erosion visible on southern side of road. Traveled way appears to have shifted southward. This section of road is approximately 20 feet across.

Currently, the road has an average width of 20.57 feet, including shoulders. The narrowest part Birchwood Lane is located from Millay Road to the road-side dumpster, with an average width of 18 feet. Erosion appears to be present around multiple culverts, which may be an explanation for the gradual reduction in road width (*Fig. 1*). There are rutted and muddy areas on the road, particularly between 9 and 35 Birchwood Lane. The portion of the road closest to the farmstand is generally in good working order (*Fig. 2*).

The applicant has requested that their application be tabled until a plan for ensuring that the road meets the Conditions of Approval can be created. As a private roadway, the maintenance of Birchwood Lane is the responsibility of all residents who live on the road. Complaints about the road condition or a lack of maintenance do not fall under the jurisdiction of the Town, but rather the road association. Currently there is no road association, and the informal association is defunct.

Stop Work Order - Order to Correct - Letter of Violation Farm Store at 50 Birchwood Lane, Bowdoinham Map R02 Lot 052

Dear Mr. & Mrs. Gaudette

I am writing in regard to your Planning Board approval for the Farm Store located at 50 Birchwood Lane in Bowdoinham.

On June 25, 2020 the Planning Board approved the Farm Store with conditions of approval. On of these conditions of approval stated:

"The road shall be upgraded to 18-feet wide with 2-foot shoulders an either side for a total width of 22 feet wide. All work to the widen the road should be on the south side of the road, or before any work is done on the north side of the road, the property pins must be located. Any cost associated with moving utilities serving the abutters, shall be borne by the applicant."

On September 2nd, 2020 I visited Birchwood Lane to ensure that the upgrade to the road meets the condition of approval set by the Planning Board. I am of the opinion that work has been conducted on the north side of the road and there is no evidence to show property pins have been located. Therefore, you are now working outside of the Planning Board's approval and this letter is Stop Work Order for all operations related to the Farm Store.

Prior to commencing work on the Farm Store, the condition of approval related to the road needs to be addressed and brought into compliance.

I am going to take this opportunity to inform you that the concrete foundation to south of the Farm Store requires a building permit. This a violation of Article 11.B.1.d of the Bowdoinham Land Use Ordinance:

"B) Permits Required

1) It shall be unlawful, without first obtaining a permit from the appropriate reviewing authority, to:

d) engage in the construction, alteration, relocation, demolition or replacement of any building or part thereof;"

At this time, I ask that you contact me no later than September 14, 2020 to discuss the violations I have outline above. I can conduct an inspection on September 15, 2020 if this works for you. I or Nicole Briand can be reached at 666-5531 or by email at <u>dcarey@bowdoinham.com</u> or <u>nbriand@bowdoinham.com</u>.

If the above Order is not followed, then I will refer this matter to the Town's Board of Selectmen for commencement of legal action in the Sagadahoc County District Court to correct the violation. If the Town is the prevailing party in enforcement litigation, you may be liable for the Town's attorney fees and costs, plus civil penalties. Fines currently accrue daily at \$100 per day per violation up to \$2500 per day per violation pursuant to Title 30-A M.R.S.A. 4452.

Dear Members of the Select Board and CEO James,

My opinion is that this application (Loud & Local) should be sent back to the Planning Board due to the applicant having 3 employees.

Mr. Favreau asked Duncan Alden, at the Feb. 27, 2024 Select Board Meeting: "how many employees do you have"? The applicant replied "three". Mr. Favreau commented to the applicant, "This changes things". Mr. Alden replied, "yes I know, bathrooms". The applicant was aware of the significance of his three employees, but omitted any mention of them in the application: referring instead "to the already permitted farmstand".

The Planning Board, in their June 25, 2020 letter to the Gaudettes, notifying them of approval for their farm stand on Page 2 of 6, Site Plan Review Approval, #12 WATER SUPPLY "The Proposed Development will be provided with an adequate supply of water. In Their Finding: "no water supply is Proposed for the farm store at this time. If employees are added to the farm store, the applicant shall amend their application with the Planning Board to meet the State's Subsurface Wastewater rules".

Again, on the Conditions of Approval Page 6 of 6 Item #2: If Employees are added to the farm store in the future, therefore requiring water & wastewater disposal, the applicant shall return to the Planning Board with an amended plan.

While the road is a major issue in itself, this is another reason why at a minimum, this application should be referred back to the Planning Board.

I am attaching some emails with conversations that Kate Gaudette and I have had in the past. The first one is from November 23, 2020 and it is when she says that she will take over the road. She doesn't mention who is going to plow the road and doesn't respond when another resident asks who is going to plow the road, etc. Another email is dated March 20, 2022. I ask Kate if she can get some gravel to put down at the bottom of Birchwood because the road is so bad that I am having trouble getting up the road. She acknowledges that the road is bad and tells me that as soon as Millay Road is no longer posted then they have plans to fix it. The last email I have attached is from June 8, 2022. I ask her for an update on fixing the road now that Millay is no longer posted. She replies back telling me that it is too expensive and that "the unnecessary financial burden placed upon us through the lawsuit from your family has really put a damper in what we are able and willing to do at this time." The lawsuit Kate is speaking about was between her and my father. This was settled out of court 2 years prior. This should have nothing to do with fixing the road. In sharing these emails with you I am showing you that Kate said she was taking over the road, knew what her responsibility was, as far as fixing the road, but then decided not to do it. Thank you for your time.

Andrea,

Thank you for your concern about the road. The contractor we hired decided not to do the work after one of the road residents left a negative review on his business. We are speaking with several other contractors but the pricing to do the job is quite high. Most are booked months out. We received no "road dues" for the last two winters from any residents other than the Estabrook Fanily. The plowing cost for this last season was substantial and the work desired is costly. The unnecessary financial burden placed upon us through the lawsuit from your family has really put a damper in what we are able and willing to do at this time. The road in its condition does not inhibit your ingress or egress.

This message is to inform you that I will be taking over the "Road Association" responsibilities as of now. I have hired a local, licensed & insured plow person to plow the road when snow removal is needed. I will bill each house at the end of the season, and will cap the amount at \$250 as to not surpass the "road dues" sum for the previous years. If the divided total is less than \$250 per household I will of course bill for the lesser amount. My goal for billing at the end of plowing season is to eliminate the need for a "road association" bank account which after consulting with my lawyers we learned is illegal. Any additional cost for plowing or road maintenance after the \$250 per home my family will endure. Each resident is on their own for driveway plowing.

I know some of you need to be able to pass the road at earlier times than others, please feel free to reach out to me via email on a storm by storm basis and I will communicate with the plow driver to ensure that everyone is able to safely ingress and egress from their homes. I am already in communication with the other neighbors in regards to this issue.

Dear Ms. Blunda,

The following is a proposal and estimate of charges to repair Birchwood Lane (Approximately 1,100.00 ' 13' -20') in Bowdoinham. As we discussed, my process is to scarify the existing surface material where possible, which will serve to re-mix the fines and stone and cut through to the bottom of potheles and ruts. I would then re-grade the road with attention to crowning and clearing shoulder growth and material so that runoff can reach side ditch lines.

As a result of our inspection of the road, it will also be necessary to install additional material since the surface is markedly recessed with respect to the road shoulders and base bank run gravel is exposed in many areas. I am suggesting that we resurface with 1&1/2" gravel as it has the best price point and is quite dense with respect to crushed rock context. Recognizing budgetary constraints, I would propose that the first 600' of Birchwood Lane up to the barn be resurfaced in phase #1 this year, and the last 500' as a phase #2 project for 2013.

DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES:

Scarify, Grade and Compact the roadbed where possible to repair depressions, potholes and ruts in the existing material. Grade back shoulder ridgelines and vegetation where necessary. Install $1\&1/2^m$ crushed gravel in designated areas as outlined.

Phase #1 Approximately 600' / 20' including 200 cubic yards of 1&1/2" gravel, labor and equipment time.

Phase #2 Approximately 500' / 13' including 126 cubic yards of 1&1/2" gravel, labor and equipment time.

\$ 3,400.00

Note: If the association chooses to resurface all areas at one time, the price would be \$ 8.400.00.

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Notes From August 13, 2008 Meeting

Insurance companies generally require anyone hired to do road maintenance by an association they insure to have a designated amount of liability insurance and that the association require a "certificate of liability insurance" be presented before work commences.

Bobby Gaudette mentioned that he didn't think that this was needed. He said that if it got to the point where people weren't going to pay or participate in the road then he would personally speak to them. Bobby also mentioned that he plans on taking care of the road and doing any maintenance to the road that is needed. He hopes to have the road paved in about a year and a half. The issue of forming a stautory road association was put on hold until further notice. - Derek had brought up how people have been going too fast on the road. There are children that ride their bikes and adults that walk on the road. allowing us to dump any trees, brush, etc. on his property. Lunch will be provided at Andrea's house afterwards.

• Andrea brought up the fact that not everyone has been paying the road dues every year and/or contributing to clean up day. Due to the fact that we are an informal road association there is no legal recourse if the homeowner/landowner refuses to pay. Andrea also mentioned that if one homeowner/landowner decides not to pay then others may follow leading to the draining of the road fund because there isn't any money going into it. This could ultimately lead to Bobby and his father (owners of the road) having to pay for everything on their own. Andrea didn't think this would be fair because if you live or have property on this road then you should have to pitch in and pay for plowing and any needed road repairs. Chris Small mentioned that he had gone to the town hall and inquired what the town's position was if the road became impassable during the spring. He was told that they would "fine" us. Bob Small said he thought that this meant the town would make the road "passable" and assess each landowner for the expense.

Bob Small came to the meeting with some information on forming a road association. As of right now we have what is called an informal road association. That means that we take the initiative to oversee the maintenance and attempt to collect the costs from all the people that use the road. However, this doesn't appear to be working. Also, having an informal road association comes with liability issues as liability insurance can only be purchased if the association is at least a statutory association. Unless the person or business doing the road maintenance has liability insurance for the work they are performing, they could be at financial risk in the event of a liability claim. Homeowner's insurance may or may not cover the work of volunteers. The other issue with having an informal road association is that it may be more difficult to get a contruction loan or a mortgage for property on our road. That means that if you are trying to sell your house or property then you may have a more difficult time doing so because banks do not want to give financing for property on a road with an informal road association. Bob Small recommended investigating what is called a statutory road association. A statutory road association would involve having yearly meetings, a board and secretary. It would provide some "civil" immunity for the officers and also enable us to purchase liability insurance for claims that we might not be immune from. This type of road association doesn't pay taxes, does not have to file any returns and ownership of the road remains the same. It would not be voluntary for landowners to participate, as the equivalent of liens and interest can be attached to deeds if the dues are not paid per the rules of the association.

Greg will plow up to Derek's driveway as Bobby Gaudette has said that he will take care of the rest of the road/his driveway fresh there. If residents would like Greg to plow their driveway then that is to remain separate and be between the resident and Greg.

The residents voted on this before Bobby Gaudette and Kate showed up (they were 30 minutes late to the meeting) and it was decided to keep Greg for plowing. However, Bobby assumed that the was going to take care of the plowing. Bobby has a snowblower that attaches to a tractor. Some of the residents wanted to keep Greg because he is dependable. He is able to plow at all hours of the night so that residents can get out and go to work at various hours. His rates are also great. If we lose him, we are afraid that we won't be able to get him back and/or get somebody to plow for the same price. Greg also has a backup person to plow us

out if his truck breaks down or if he goes on vacation. After a big discussion we decided to keep Greg for plowing for another year. We may revisit this topic again next year though.

- Greg doesn't have a sander to do the road. Last year we used John Cote but that was a little pricey because he charged us \$165.00. Heather is going to check with setting a quote for \$115-125 to sand the road was an acceptable amount. We will only require this service if the road gets very slippery and icey. There is a definite need for sanding the road when it gets extremely icey because a couple residents have to walk their children to the end of the road to catch the school bus.  and their guests need to slow down on the road. We just all need to slow down and
 pass it along to the people that visit and travel on the road.
- Road dues are due by September 1, 2017 to Andrea Blunda. Due to the fact that
 she pays the plow bills and any other needed bills that occur on the road- the
 checks will be made out to her and she will put it in the account.

Note: The increase of road dues was not discussed at this meeting. Therefore, they will remain at \$250 for next year.

Bobby Gaudette mentioned that he is going to be doing some road work. He
wants to put down 30 yards of 3/8ths inch gravel. Heather is going to check in
with her uncle who works for Labbe to see if he can deliver this. We will make 2
or 3 separate piles on the side of the road for Bobby. Bobby Gaudette will use his

tractor and spread it throughout the entire road. The residents agreed to pay Bobby \$35 an hour for his tractor work. A bill for the gravel and tractor work amount will be given to Andrea and she will get a check to the necessary people.

Bobby Gaudette also suggested at last year's meeting to have a delivery of crushed stone so that he could put it down on the road to help with the pot holes, etc. and that was an expense.
- Everyone seems to be happy with the plowing that Greg West has been doing. Andrea has been in contact with Greg to check in as to what he would be charging to plow this year. His plowing rate for the road will remain the same, at \$90. He will not go up on prices this year. Greg will plow up to Derek's driveway as Bobby Gaudette has said that he will take care of the rest of the road/his driveway from there. If residents would like Greg to plow their driveway then that is to remain separate and be between the resident and Greg.
- Greg doesn't have a sander to do the road. Sanding the road when it gets icy is an ongoing issue. Last winter we spent a total of \$750 just on sand delivery. Unfortunately we are unable to continue spending this much on sanding when everyone on the road is not contributing to the road fee. There is a definite need for sanding the road when it gets extremely icy because a couple residents have to walk their children to the end of the road to catch the school bus. Since there is a

- We had 11 plowable storms this year compared to the 12 the previous year. We
 had expenses from food and drinks from clean up day last year as well. We had
 Greg mow the sides of the road ahead of clean up day to make it easier for
 residents to cut back trees, etc along the sides of the road.
- Since the annual road meeting was held months earlier then in previous years Greg didn't have plow rates available yet. Last winter his rate was \$90 per storm. His rates are cheap for what he does. It was agreed that we should keep him for plowing this year. Andrea mentioned that even when his rates have gone up in the past it has only been by \$5-10. Ally asked if we could ask Greg on the storm days that are blizzard like if he could at least give us access by 3am. Ally works early mornings for her job and needs to get out. Andrea will mention this to Greg. Greg usually comes by 5am so that residents can get out to get to work, but Andrea will see if he can come earlier. As always, if residents would like Greg to plow their driveway then that is to remain separate and be between the resident and Greg.
- We discussed having Greg mow the sides of the road again with a sickle bar or bush hog. Greg did this last year ahead of clean up day and it made cleaning up the sides of the road easier. Andrea will contact Greg to see if he is available to do this 1-2 weeks before clean up day. Last year he charged us \$125.

- Clean-up day this year will happen on October 12, 2019 with a rain date of
 October 19th. It will go from 9:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m. Everyone will meet at John
 and Andrea's house and from there we will pick up trash, cut down any needed
 tree branches, bushes, etc. and haul away the brush. Lunch will be provided at
 Andrea's house afterwards. Andrea will send out a reminder e-mail 1 week before.
- The road is in bad shape and needs maintenance. There were 2 suggestions that had been previously mentioned. The first suggestion was from Bobby Gaudette to spend \$1500 to purchase gravel to fill in the potholes. Bobby would use his tractor and do the work himself. The second suggestion was from Bob and Chris Small who have a tow behind grader box (purchased from a tractor dealer) which is designed for the express purpose of leveling and repairing "camp roads." Since the grader box moves existing gravel into potholes, they have estimated \$500-600 worth of gravel will be needed to repair the road. Bob has a tractor and a small dump truck and Chris has experience using the grader box. There will be some fuel cost for diesel. It was agreed upon to have a budget of \$575 for this project. \$500 for the gravel and \$75 for the diesel. To try to make this work go as smoothly as possible, the work will be done in the evenings. The hope is that residents will be home from work when Chris is doing the repairs.
- There is some concern that when the road does get repaired that it will be treated as a "race track." Residents had concerns that we are spending money to make much needed repairs to the road and if cars go too fast then the gravel is going to go up in dust. This will mean more repairs will be needed each year. Residents present at the meeting agreed to speak to any guests they saw going too fast. There are children present on this road and residents enjoy walking on the road. We can't have people speeding on a 1 lane road.
- Road dues are due by August 1, 2019 in the amount of \$250 to Andrea Blunda. Due to the fact that she pays the plow bills and any other needed bills that occur on the road- the checks will be made out to her and she will put it in the account. We discussed the need for eventually increasing the road dues. Due to the increase in the amount of traffic that the road gets, yearly road maintenance may be a must. This may get costly indicating the need for increasing the dues. Next year we will re-visit this issue. However, everyone present at the meeting was in agreement that probably by next year the dues will be going up. Andrea will send out a reminder e-mail 1 week before road dues are due.

Dear Ms. Blunda,

The following is a proposal and estimate of charges to repair Birchwood Lane (Approximately 1,100.00' /13'-20') in Bowdoinham. As we discussed, my process is to scarify the existing surface material where possible, which will serve to re-mix the fines and stone and cut through to the bottom of potholes and ruts. I would then re-grade the road with attention to crowning and clearing shoulder growth and material so that runoff can reach side ditch lines.

As a result of our inspection of the road, it will also be necessary to install additional material since the surface is markedly recessed with respect to the road shoulders and base bank run gravel is exposed in many areas. I am suggesting that we resurface with $1\&1/2^n$ gravel as it has the best price point and is quite dense with respect to crushed rock content. Recognizing budgetary constraints, I would propose that the first 600' of Birchwood Lane up to the bam be resurfaced in phase #1 this year, and the last 500' as a phase #2 project for 2013.

DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES:

Scarify, Grade and Compact the readhed where possible to repair depressions, potholes and ruts in the existing material. Grade back shoulder ridgelines and vegetation where necessary. Install 1&1/2" crushed gravel in designated areas as outlined.

Phase #1 Approximately 600' / 20' including 200 cubic yards of 1&1/2" gravel, labor and equipment time.

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Notes From August 13, 2008 Meeting

Insurance companies generally require anyone hired to do road maintenance by an association they insure to have a designated amount of liability insurance and that the association require a "certificate of liability insurance" be presented before work commences.

Bobby Gaudette mentioned that he didn't think that this was needed. He said that if it got to the point where people weren't going to pay or participate in the road then he would personally speak to them. Bobby also mentioned that he plans on taking care of the road and doing any maintenance to the road that is needed. He hopes to have the road paved in about a year and a half. The issue of forming a stautory road association was put on hold until further notice. allowing us to dump any trees, brush, etc. on his property. Lunch will be provided at Andrea's house afterwards.

• Andrea brought up the fact that not everyone has been paying the road dues every year and/or contributing to clean up day. Due to the fact that we are an informal road association there is no legal recourse if the homeowner/landowner refuses to pay. Andrea also mentioned that if one homeowner/landowner decides not to pay then others may follow leading to the draining of the road fund because there isn't any money going into it. This could ultimately lead to Bobby and his father (owners of the road) having to pay for everything on their own. Andrea didn't think this would be fair because if you live or have property on this road then you should have to pitch in and pay for plowing and any needed road repairs. Chris Small mentioned that he had gone to the town hall and inquired what the town's position was if the road became impassable during the spring. He was told that they would "fine" us. Bob Small said he thought that this meant the town would make the road "passable" and assess each landowner for the expense.

Bob Small came to the meeting with some information on forming a road association. As of right now we have what is called an informal road association. That means that we take the initiative to oversee the maintenance and attempt to collect the costs from all the people that use the road. However, this doesn't appear to be working. Also, having an informal road association comes with liability issues as liability insurance can only be purchased if the association is at least a statutory association. Unless the person or business doing the road maintenance has liability insurance for the work they are performing, they could be at financial risk in the event of a liability claim. Homeowner's insurance may or may not cover the work of volunteers. The other issue with having an informal road association is that it may be more difficult to get a contruction loan or a mortgage for property on our road. That means that if you are trying to sell your house or property then you may have a more difficult time doing so because banks do not want to give financing for property on road with an informal road association. Bob Small reccommended investigating what is called a statutory road association. A statutory road association would involve having yearly meetings, a board and secretary. It would provide some "civil" immunity for the officers and also enable us to purchase liability insurance for claims that we might not be immune from. This type of road association doesn't pay taxes, does not have to file any returns and ownership of the road remains the same. It would not be voluntary for landowners to participate, as the equivalent of liens and interest can be attached to deeds if the dues are not paid per the rules of the association.

- Everyone seems to be happy with the plowing that Greg West has been doing. Andrea has been in contact with Greg to check in as to what he would be charging to plow this year. His plowing rate for the road will remain the same, at \$90. He will not go up on prices this year. Greg will plow up to Derek's driveway as Bobby Gaudette has said that he will take care of the rest of the road/his driveway from there. If residents would like Greg to plow their driveway then that is to remain separate and be between the resident and Greg.
 The residents voted on this before Bobby Gaudette and Kate showed up (they

The residents voted on this before Bobby Gaudette and Kate showed up (they were 30 minutes late to the meeting) and it was decided to keep Greg for plowing. However, Bobby assumed that he was going to take care of the plowing. Bobby has a snowblower that attaches to a tractor. Some of the residents wanted to keep Greg because he is dependable. He is able to plow at all hours of the night so that residents can get out and go to work at various hours. His rates are also great. If we lose him, we are afraid that we won't be able to get him back and/or get somebody to plow for the same price. Greg also has a backup person to plow us

out if his truck breaks down or if he goes on vacation. After a big discussion we decided to keep Greg for plowing for another year. We may revisit this topic again next year though.

- Greg doesn't have a sander to do the road. Last year we used John Cote but that was a little pricey because he charged us \$165.00. Heather is going to check with her uncle who works for Labbe to see if he will do it. The residents agreed that getting a quote for \$115-125 to sand the road was an acceptable amount. We will only require this service if the road gets very slippery and icey. There is a definite need for sanding the road when it gets extremely icey because a couple residents have to walk their children to the end of the road to catch the school bus. Since there is a hill where they have to walk, we need to make sure that is safe.
- Clean-up day this year will happen on October 7, 2017 with a rain date of October 14th. It will go from 9:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m. Everyone will meet at John and Andrea's house and from there we will pick up trash, cut down any needed tree branches, bushes, etc. and haul away the brush. Bobby Gaudette mentioned that if we make piles along the side of the road then he can come along and pick them up to dump the brush, etc. on his land. Lunch will be provided at Andrea's house afterwards.
- Andrea brought up the fact that not everyone has been paying the road dues every year and/or contributing to clean up day.
- John had brought up how people are still going too fast on the road. Residents
 and their guests need to slow down on the road. We just all need to slow down and
 pass it along to the people that visit and travel on the road.
- Road dues are due by September 1, 2017 to Andrea Blunda. Due to the fact that she pays the plow bills and any other needed bills that occur on the roadthe checks will be made out to her and she will put it in the account.

Note: The increase of road dues was not discussed at this meeting. Therefore, they will remain at \$250 for next year.

Bobby Gaudette mentioned that he is going to be doing some road work. He
wants to put down 30 yards of 3/8ths inch gravel. Heather is going to check in
with her uncle who works for Labbe to see if he can deliver this. We will make 2
or 3 separate piles on the side of the road for Bobby. Bobby Gaudette will use his

tractor and spread it throughout the entire road. The residents agreed to pay Bobby \$35 an hour for his tractor work. A bill for the gravel and tractor work amount will be given to Andrea and she will get a check to the necessary people.

- Everyone seems to be happy with the plowing that Greg West has been doing. Andrea has been in contact with Greg to check in as to what he would be charging to plow this year. His plowing rate for the road will remain the same, at \$90. He will not go up on prices this year. Greg will plow up to Derek's driveway as Bobby Gaudette has said that he will take care of the rest of the road/his driveway from there. - Greg doesn't have a sander to do the road. Sanding the road when it gets icy is an ongoing issue. Last winter we spent a total of \$750 just on sand delivery. - We had 11 plowable storms this year compared to the 12 the previous year. We had expenses from food and drinks from clean up day last year as well. We had Greg mow the sides of the road ahead of clean up day to make it easier for residents to cut back trees, etc along the sides of the road.
- Since the annual road meeting was held months earlier then in previous years Greg didn't have plow rates available yet. Last winter his rate was \$90 per storm. His rates are cheap for what he does. It was agreed that we should keep him for plowing this year. Andrea mentioned that even when his rates have gone up in the past it has only been by \$5-10. Ally asked if we could ask Greg on the storm days that are blizzard like if he could at least give us access by 3am. Ally works early mornings for her job and needs to get out. Andrea will mention this to Greg. Greg usually comes by 5am so that residents can get out to get to work, but Andrea will see if he can come earlier. As always, if residents would like Greg to plow their driveway then that is to remain separate and be between the resident and Greg.
- We discussed having Greg mow the sides of the road again with a sickle bar or bush hog. Greg did this last year ahead of clean up day and it made cleaning up the sides of the road easier. Andrea will contact Greg to see if he is available to do this 1-2 weeks before clean up day. Last year he charged us \$125.

- Clean-up day this year will happen on October 12, 2019 with a rain date of
 October 19th. It will go from 9:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m. Everyone will meet at John
 and Andrea's house and from there we will pick up trash, cut down any needed
 tree branches, bushes, etc. and haul away the brush. Lunch will be provided at
 Andrea's house afterwards. Andrea will send out a reminder e-mail 1 week before.
- The road is in bad shape and needs maintenance. There were 2 suggestions that had been previously mentioned. The first suggestion was from Bobby Gaudette to spend \$1500 to purchase gravel to fill in the potholes. Bobby would use his tractor and do the work himself. The second suggestion was from Bob and Chris Small who have a tow behind grader box (purchased from a tractor dealer) which is designed for the express purpose of leveling and repairing "camp roads." Since the grader box moves existing gravel into potholes, they have estimated \$500-600 worth of gravel will be needed to repair the road. Bob has a tractor and a small dump truck and Chris has experience using the grader box. There will be some fuel cost for diesel. It was agreed upon to have a budget of \$575 for this project. \$500 for the gravel and \$75 for the diesel. To try to make this work go as smoothly as possible, the work will be done in the evenings. The hope is that residents will be home from work when Chris is doing the repairs.
- There is some concern that when the road does get repaired that it will be treated as a "race track." Residents had concerns that we are spending money to make much needed repairs to the road and if cars go too fast then the gravel is going to go up in dust. This will mean more repairs will be needed each year. Residents present at the meeting agreed to speak to any guests they saw going too fast. There are children present on this road and residents enjoy walking on the road. We can't have people speeding on a 1 lane road.
- Road dues are due by August 1, 2019 in the amount of \$250 to Andrea Blunda. Due to the fact that she pays the plow bills and any other needed bills that occur on the road- the checks will be made out to her and she will put it in the account. We discussed the need for eventually increasing the road dues. Due to the increase in the amount of traffic that the road gets, yearly road maintenance may be a must. This may get costly indicating the need for increasing the dues. Next year we will re-visit this issue. However, everyone present at the meeting was in agreement that probably by next year the dues will be going up. Andrea will send out a reminder e-mall 1 week before road dues are due.

Thank you for your time in speaking to me today and letting my wife and I review the Gaudette property file. In the interests of brevity, I am attaching a copy of my letter to the Select Board, Page 6 of Exhibit 1, (Conditions of approval), my son's Derek's measurements of the road taken Sunday 2/25/2024, Kate Gaudette's recent e-mail to you and a letter I found in the Gaudette file today from my daughter Andrea Blunda, dated August 23, 2020. During Covid, Andrea worked from home. She also had security cameras at the end of her driveway. I feel this letter will better explain Kate's representation in her 2/28/2024 e-mail "the many truckloads of fill that we have put in over the years". Finally, the conditions of approval did not specify "X" amount of fill or "X" amount of money spent, but rather what the results were to be: 18' wide with 2' shoulders. Thank you again for your time and for answering my questions.

Select Board Meeting February 27,2024

Dear Members of the Select Board,

The application you are considering indicates the new Medical Marijuana farmstand business, "Loud and Local" will be using the previously "permitted" building that Bobby and Kate Gaudette built and did business in as Ancient Green Farms. However, measurements, testimony and photos indicate that certain performance standards set forth in the Land Use Ordinance and /or conditions of approval for Ancient Green Farms year 2020 Site Plan permit are not being currently met. The Select Board has the right to deny a license renewal under these conditions. I believe a denial would apply to a successor business as they should be only allowed to operate once these performance standards are met.

Permits for Ancient Green Farm were approved by the Planning Board at their meeting on June 25, 2020 after a Planning Board Site Review zoom meeting of 4/30/2020, Site Plan Review meeting of 5/28/2020, and another zoom meeting of 6/25/20. There was a huge submission of comments and letters on this from interested parties. The Planning Board spent a lot of time considering this application and accompanying correspondence. They were aware that it was an unusual situation having a retail business at the end of a gravel dead end road in a residential neighborhood. They wanted to minimize its impact on the neighbors aesthetically and also mitigate safety issues due to the increased traffic. We thank them for the time they spent on this.

The approval letter from the Planning Board to Kate and Robert Gaudette (III), and Robert Gaudette Jr. (father) dated June 25, 2020, outlined the conditions of approval. Duncan Alden has included this letter in his new application. (Exhibit #1)

The major non-compliance issue is the road. **Vehicular Access** is **#1** on the first page of Findings and Conclusion with the Finding reading "The applicant is proposing to upgrade the road to 18 feet with 2-foot shoulders. Further along it says "Any cost associated with moving utilities serving the abutters, shall be borne by applicant". **#3** on Page 1 addresses **Pedestrian Circulation** indicating the "proposed lay-out" (22 foot wide road) will provide for safe pedestrian

circulation, both on-site and off-site (road). On page 6, Conditions of Approval, #7 takes the proposals of the applicant further and states: "The road shall be upgraded to 18-feet with 2-foot shoulders on either side for a total width of 22 feet".

In consideration of this new application, Derek Small, our son, measured the width of the road in 25 spots 50 feet apart beginning 5 feet in from the beginning of the road, all the way to the end (Exhibit 2). Discounting the last two measurements, which are smaller but at the end of the roadway, the other 23 average under 16 feet, substantially less than the 22 foot requirement. Not only does the road not meet one of the "Conditions of Approval" it is not safe for pedestrians as required in the Land Use Ordinances.

Exhibit 3 shows one pole that would have to be moved to widen the road to 22 feet. The area opposite the pole is Chris Small's yard. The white dots and black dots are pot holes. Exhibit 4 shows tracks off the road (on the left) where possibly someone was avoiding an oncoming vehicle from the blind curve. Exhibit 5 shows narrowness of the road between the pole on the left with dropoffs on both sides.

Another major non- compliance issue is lighting. Referring back to "The Site Plan Review Approval" Exhibit 1, Page 2, Item 6. Lighting "All exterior lighting will be designed to avoid undue glare, adverse impact on neighboring properties and rights-of-ways, and the unnecessary lighting of the night sky". Exhibit 6a and 6b indicate the lighting in that area has changed substantially, capable of lighting up the sky and the forest, from how it was proposed on #4i in the original Gaudette application. The same description of lighting is also the 4i response in the Duncan Alden application. This lighting does not meet the requirements of the Land Use Ordinance.

Buffering and Landscaping have also failed to materialize. CEO James states in his letter to the Select Board on 2/20/24 that "Landscaping has yet to fully grow in but has been otherwise planted as approved". Photos taken on 2/25/2024 show that the 3 Juniper trees that were planted 4 years ago are mostly dead. Exhibit 7.

A final observation: Much of the new application was taken verbatim from the original 2020 Gaudette application. 4d of the application states that "Birchwood

lane will be widened to specifications set fourth by the Bowdoinham Land Use Ordinance. The gravel road (Birchwood lane) will be brought to a minimum of 18" wide WITH 2 foot shoulders. The parking lot of the proposed storefront and the road is under contract with Tourtelotte Excavation and will be covered with gravel" The applicant signed the application which certifies that "I have read and completely understand the application; I certify that the information contained in this application and its attachments are true and correct;" Exhibit 8 a and b.

Is the applicant aware of what he is promising to do and is he going to follow through with 4d in the near future?


If not, then the Conditions of Approval for this business will not have been met.

Any cost associated with moving utilities serving the abutters, shall be borne by the applicant.

I just wanted to express a concern that I had regarding the activity happening at 50 Birchwood Lane. During the week of August 10, 2020 a dump truck hauling a trailer made a few trips up the road bringing an excavator, roller and a bulldozer. I just assumed that road work on the widening of the road was about to begin. However, that was not the case. These pieces of heavy equipment were brought to 50 Birchwood Lane and remained on the property. On August 13th and 14th dump trucks came back and forth every 15 minutes all day long. I could hear the use of the heavy equipment but was unsure what was going on. I have since discovered that Robert and Kate Gaudette have put in a road that is leading to a "wellness center" that is located behind the farm stand. In the monthly meetings that I attended I don't remember a wellness center being brought up. I have also reviewed the meeting minutes from May 28th and June 25th and nothing was brought up about this. This is just one more thing that will bring an increase in traffic. There still isn't a bathroom facility on the premises. The Gaudette's have done nothing to improve the road so having dump trucks go back and forth for 2 days straight didn't help. I would appreciate it if someone could look into this increased activity on their property. Thank you.

Hi Matt,

I would like to bring some things to attention after last nights planning board meeting:

There was a claim that there has never been any road work done to Birchwood lane since 2015 when we bought the property. I have supporting documents for the road upgrade, new culverts, extra width and receipts for the many dump truck loads of fill that we have put in over the years. There is even a stop work order from the Town of Bowdoinham from when the Smalls claimed we did work to the north side of the road (a condition of approval for the original application) Where Darren came out to Birchwood lane and verified that the North side had not been touched and we found all the boundary pins.

There was a claim that the road is so overgrown that bushes scrape passing vehicles yet I spent days last fall trimming back all the growth.

Basically every condition of approval was met by us when opening the original farm stand, down to the lighting (which is now a problem by the way). Everything was approved by Darren and based on the testimony of Bob Small last night he claims that we did not meet the promised standards.

I want to work on making sure everything is properly met as soon as possible so Duncan may operate his business. Please let me know your findings after going out to inspect to road - if you set an appointment I will try my best to be there with Duncan to go over it all. I have so much documentation of everything that was done to the road in addition to all the complaints while the road work was being done. I feel the road is a non issue. My father in law can drive his tractor trailer down the road and cars are able to pass uninhibited. The fire department ever came out with their trucks to test the road width and parking lot and it was found sufficient.

At this time we have no plans to do any upgrades to Birchwood lane. If the abutters want to finally put in their road maintenance dues of \$250 per year that they have never put in that maybe some changes could happen but to put it all on one person to be financially responsible for their demands is not right.

You have been so accommodating in working with Bobby, myself and Duncan and I sincerely appreciate your time and response.

- > Thanks for reaching out about this. I wasn't sure what had been done since you received your Planning Board approval, but I received "complaints" from two neighbors regarding the condition of the road. I let Duncan know about the complaints so that he would be prepared for the meeting.
- > I think if Duncan were to let the Board know that this roadwork was done, it would most likely be sufficient! I personally didn't see anything wrong with the road during my last inspection, but I didn't take any measurements at the time. The approved width was 18 feet with 2-foot shoulders, so as long it is at least that wide it will be fine. I don't know what, if anything, the board will require as part of their license.

Hello. I am attaching a letter that I was planning on reading at the meeting on the 27th but I never did. Please let me know if you have any further questions for me. Thank you for your time.

As a condition to getting the farm stand permit, Birchwood Lane was supposed to get widened and be fixed. That simply has not happened. When I leave my driveway or come home, there are 3 obstacles that I have to contend with: potholes, overgrown brush hitting my car and oncoming vehicles. When I drive down the road it is in a zig-zag kind of way to avoid the obstacles in my path. Before I leave my driveway I have to look down the road to make sure there aren't any vehicles coming. If there are, then I have to sit in my driveway and wait for them to pass. When I am driving down Birchwood Lane if I come across an on coming car then one of us has to move over. When I say move over, I mean finding the nearest driveway and pulling into it. There isn't enough road available to just move over. If you did that then you would be off the road in a ditch.

There is also a dip in the road in front of my house. This is where a new culvert was installed 4 years ago. I believe that this is due to the sand settling and it is getting worse with the amount of traffic driving over it.

When I heard that the road was going to be widened, I was sure that telephone poles would have to be moved. Referencing your meeting minutes from June 25, 2020 it said that any work done to widen the road be done on the south side. One instance I am thinking of is the pole in front of 35 Birchwood Lane. 2 cars are not able to pass at the same time, so if the road was to be widened then a pole would have to be moved. Another issue with the road is the ability for delivery trucks to come up. When the road is at its worse, either during mud season or during the winter, some residents have been told on several occasions by the UPS driver that he wouldn't come up the road to deliver.

On November 23, 2020 Kate Gaudette had emailed me and informed me she would be taking over the road association. On March 20, 2022 I emailed Kate Gaudette about the condition of the road. I mentioned that the road was impassable for emergency vehicles, as well as, some of the residents' vehicles and possibly delivery drivers. I asked if gravel could be put down. Kate replied back to me on the same day saying that they are aware of the situation and have plans for work to be done as the contractor is able to. They were waiting for the road not to be posted so gravel could be delivered. A couple months later on June 8, 2022 I emailed Kate again wondering when the road was going to be fixed. She replied back to me and told me that the plowing cost for the last season was substantial and the work desired is costly. They had an unnecessary financial burden placed upon them and it put a damper on what they are able and willing to do at this time. Referencing your meeting minutes from June 25, 2020, it was determined that the applicant has the financial ability to complete the proposed development. My question is, does he still have the financial capacity?

I would like to give you a little history of Birchwood Lane. When I first moved onto this road it was just Chris Small and I. He plowed the road and myself out when needed. As more residents moved in we decided to have an unofficial road association. Each household paid in \$250.00 per year. I held a road meeting every June where we discussed how much money we spent on plowing from the previous winter, how much money was in the account, who would be plowing the road for the upcoming winter, what maintenance work needed to be done and we would schedule a clean up day. During the clean up day we would pick up trash, trim the brush back and haul away the brush we knocked down. At every meeting I gave out a budget sheet to everyone that had a breakdown of what the money was spent on and how I got to the end result of how much money was left. I also had an agenda and took notes on everything that we discussed. After the meeting I typed up the notes and sent a copy to everyone. Anyone who wanted to come to the meeting with name(s) of a plow driver was encouraged. If there

was a way to get someone to plow the road who was cheaper, I always welcomed it. However, when the Gaudette's moved in they wanted to take everything over. Our clean up days no longer occurred so the brush began to get overgrown. There were never any meetings held. Kate refused to give the name of whoever she found to plow the road. She told everyone to pay \$250.00 but we were never sure where all of this money went. She never offered to give a break down of where the money was going and what was left. She would just say, "whatever we go over in funds for plowing, my family will cover." That could mean a lot of things. Essentially she wanted all the residents to give her money so that she could make all the decisions as to where that money was going. That just didn't sit well for many of us.

In conclusion I would just like to say that in the meeting minutes from April 30, 2020 it says, "The applicant stated that fixing the road was their first priority." This hasn't happened in 4 years so I am just wondering when that will happen.

Bringing the heavy equipment/ even just a skid steer too Birchwood lane that is needed to complete this job will require Millay Road and Birchwood Lane to dry up so that the machinery does not cause further damage. With a job like this there are many facets involved that require careful planning and coordination.

I guarantee the repairs WILL be completed this spring. We should all be very aware by now of the inconvenience that living on a private dirt road during mud season can cause. All I can offer at this time is to plan accordingly and utilize the periods with out rain or a ground freeze to your advantage. It is also not uncommon for delivery companies to refuse delivery to dirt roads this time of year, statewide.
