Notes from Tammy:

- Start seasonally a first
- Pop ups through holidays with breads/baked goods for sale.
- Could have a vending machine for healthy snacks for folks who are using the trail to keep the venue selling 24-7, which will drive customers to the venue to learn more. (Bixby, grandy oats, etc.)
- Host a Focus Group to determine what they want to see. Include artisans, seniors, school kids, pantry folks.
- Include signage around location identifying historic locations and other venues in town.

Events:

Maine Craft Weekend – Statewide Tour of Maine Craft Studios, Breweries, Businesses and Events – sign up to solicit to Bowdoinham to be a host site for this event. This is the first weekend in October. You get lots of free promotion.
