### What is this thing?

- A documentation of community assets and goals.
  - What do we have? Where do we want to go?
    - Stay right here" is a decision and takes action
    - "Manage Change, rather than Be Changed"
- Created by the citizens of Bowdoinham
- Updated every 10 years
- Does not create rules, but charts a direction
- Divided into chapters (economy, agriculture, housing etc.)

### How was the 2034 plan updated?

- Present or former committee members include plumbers, farmers, doctors, electricians, developers, engineers, lawyers, and more
- Built off of 2014 plan
- 44 committee meetings
- Public surveys
- 7 Public Forums
- Collaboration with BCDI
- Workshops with the Planning Board
- Workshops with the Select Board
- Interactive tables at Celebrate Bowdoinham



## Vision Statement:

"In 2034, Bowdoinham is a quiet rural Maine community defined visually by agricultural landscapes, abundant woods and wetlands, a commercial village center and historic buildings."

## What's new in the plan?

#### Building in the same direction from 2014!

- $\odot$  Leaning into the ideas of "rural feel" , small town, outdoor recreation.
- $\odot$  Calls for more engagement with new committees and plans
  - Conservation Commission, Historic Preservation Plan, Public Health Committee etc. Get involved!

- $\circ$  Greater population
- $\odot$  More older residents and more young families
- More development (here and in neighboring communities)
- New experiences with pandemic, solar energy, e-mobility, extreme weather



### Economy

 $\odot$  Support local businesses

 Implement Walkable Village Plan, waterfront redevelopment, Merrymeeting trail

• New

 $\odot$  Capitalize on remote work

 Plan for energy infrastructure to meet higher electricity demands for transportation and heating/cooling

 Continue support of local agriculture for economic, ecologic and social benefits

- Recognize increased development pressure
- Create an Agricultural Conservation
   Plan



### Forest Resources

**OPromote sustainable forest management**

 $\odot \mbox{Educate}$  forest owners about new invasive pests

(emerald ash borer and wooly adelgid and brown tail moth, oh my!)
 Recognize the role forests play in climate change
 Encourage development of new forest resources through the town and school

## Natural Resources & Water Resources



## Historic & Archaeological Resources

#### • Same

Promote maintenance and restoration of historic sites (buildings, cemeteries)

#### $\circ\,\text{New}$

Create and implement a Historic Preservation Plan
 Preserve and enhance the historic character of the village



### Recreation

• Same

 $\odot$  Promote & protect outdoor recreational opportunities  $\odot$  Develop recreational opportunities for all ages

 $\circ\,\text{New}$ 

 $\odot$  Support new recreational opportunities at the Waterfront Park  $\odot$  Enhance existing recreation areas (eg. Lights at the rec fields )













## Housing

• Same

 $\odot$  Encourage safe and affordable housing opportunities consistent with the rest of the Comprehensive Plan

 $\circ$  New

Direct development to the village areas with public water
 Create a new land use district served by Richmond Utilities (sewer and water)
 Support the work of the new Housing Sub Committee



### Transportation

Same

 Plan for and develop an efficient transportation system

Cars, bikes, walking

 $\circ New$ 

 $\odot$  Plan for E-Mobility infrastructure

(charging stations)

 $\circ$ Investigate traffic calming measures



## Public Facilities and Services

#### • Same

 Plan for and develop efficient public facilities and services

### $\circ New$

 $\odot$  Improve accessibility to public facilities  $\odot$  Resolve cell phone dead zones



### Fiscal Capacity and Capital Investment Plan

• Same

 Plan for an efficient system of public services to get the most bang for a buck

 $\circ New$ 

 Plan for an efficient system of public services to get the most bang for a buck



### Land Use

### • Same

 Encouraging development in appropriate areas while preserving the rural character.

#### $\circ New$

- Direct growth to areas served by public utilities
- Encourage alternative and cooperative wastewater treatment systems
- $\odot \mbox{Preserve}$  open space and farmland better



## Sea Level Rise & Climate Change

#### • Same

 $\odot \text{Plan}$  for changes in our environment

#### $\circ \mathsf{New}$

Shift emphasis from sea level rise to climate change and extreme weather events
Develop Climate Action Plan
Enroll in Community Resiliency Partnership (provides municipal assistance)



## NEW Section: Age Friendly

- The vision of Age Friendly Bowdoinham is to foster changes in the physical and social environment to make Bowdoinham a better place to live for people of all ages and abilities.
  - Improve Transportation options
    - "Rides in Neighbors Cars"
  - $\odot \mbox{Improve Access to Healthcare Resources}$
  - Improve Walkability / Accessibility
  - $\odot \text{Support}$  Aging in Place
  - $\odot \mbox{Reduce Social Isolation}$
  - OSupport the Age Friendly Bowdoinham committee



## NEW Section: Public Health

- Plan for public health threats like:
   OPandemics
   OToxic Spills
  - Extreme weather events
    - (heat, cold, flooding, fire)
- Meet Emergency Service Needs
- Create a Public Health Committee
