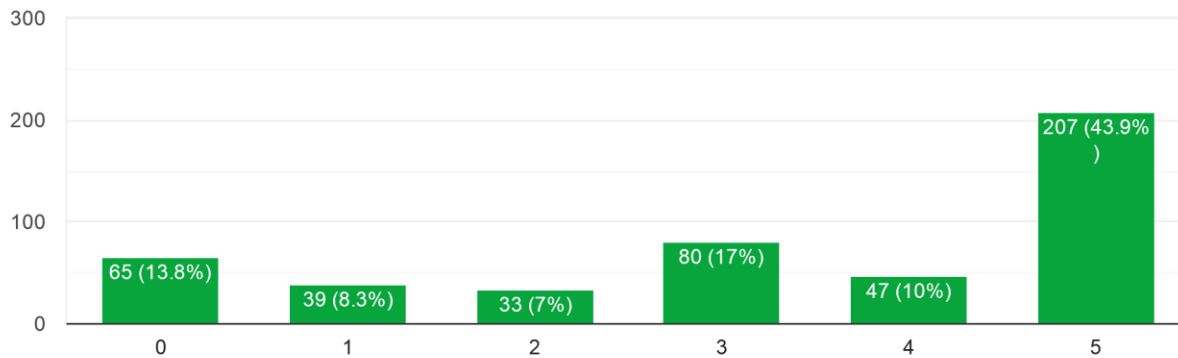

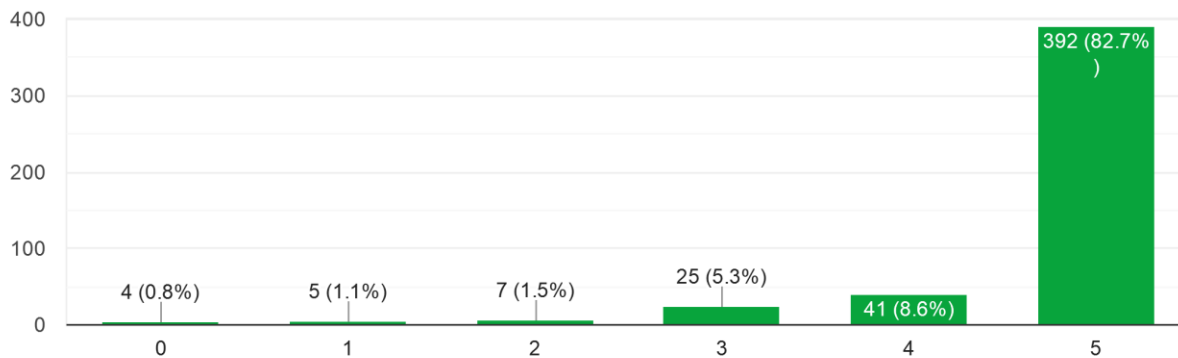
Curbside recycling collection

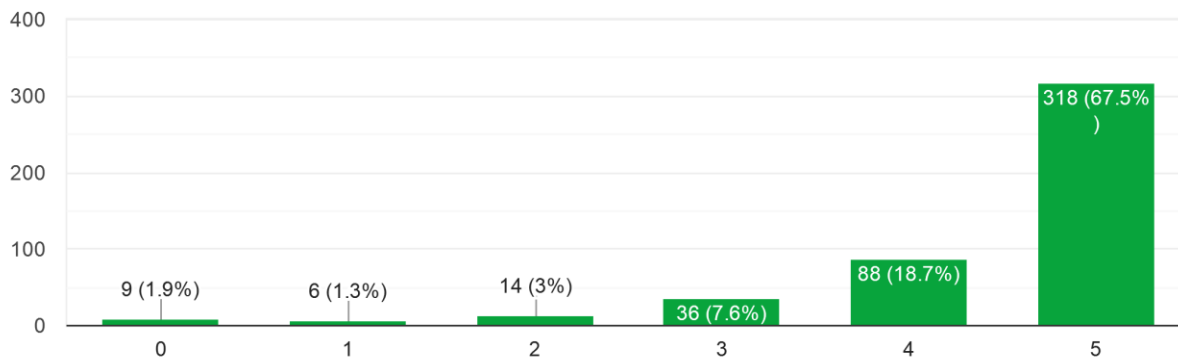
A local facility where residents can bring recycling and waste material

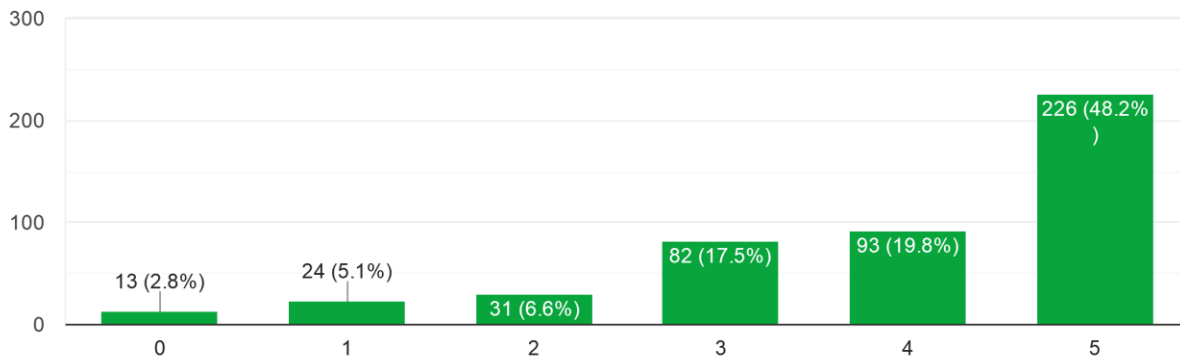
Hazardous waste disposal (lightbulbs, paint, batteries, etc.)

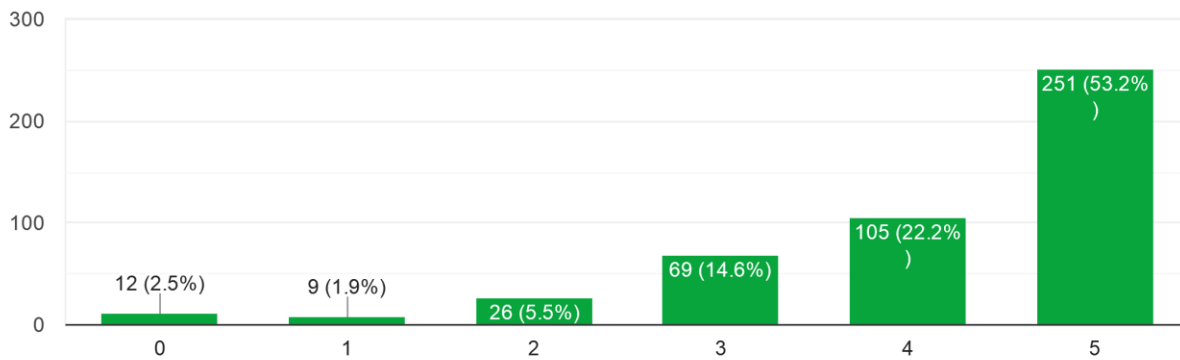
Electronics disposal (printers, computers, etc.)

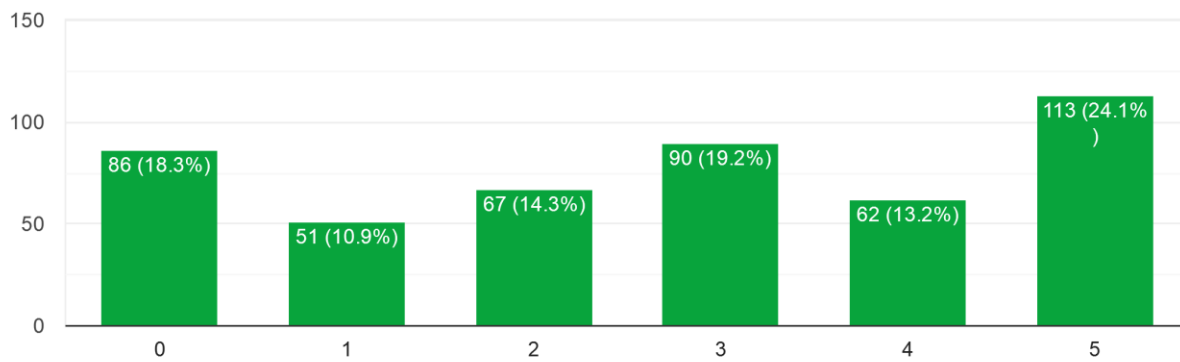
Oversized bulky waste disposal (furniture, mattresses, appliances and other large items)

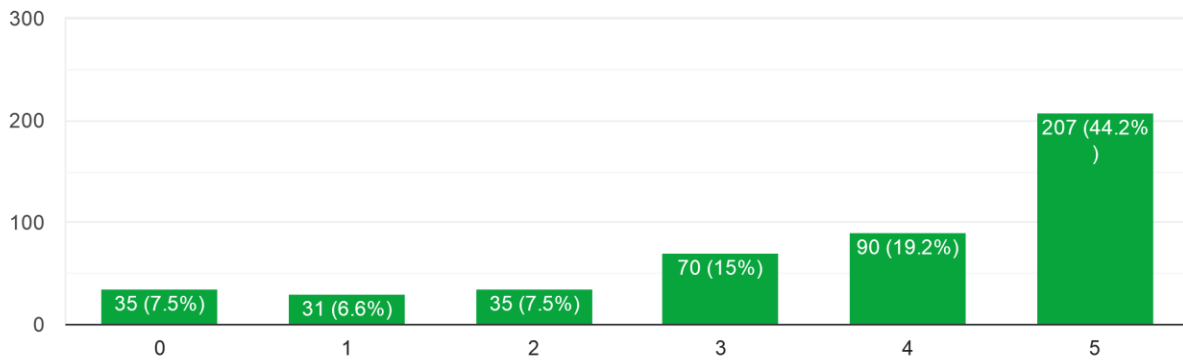
Tire disposal

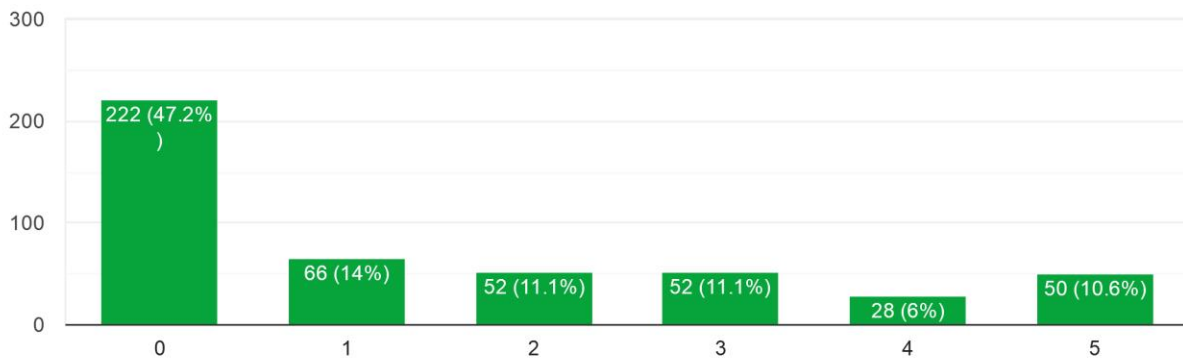

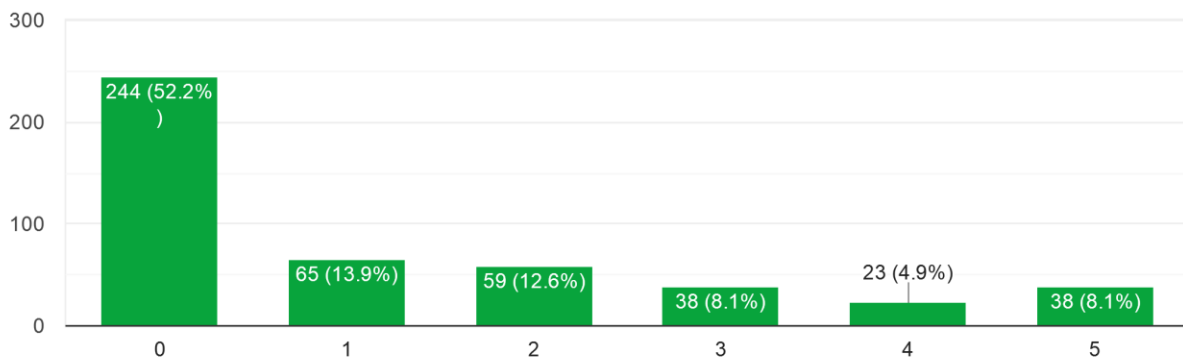

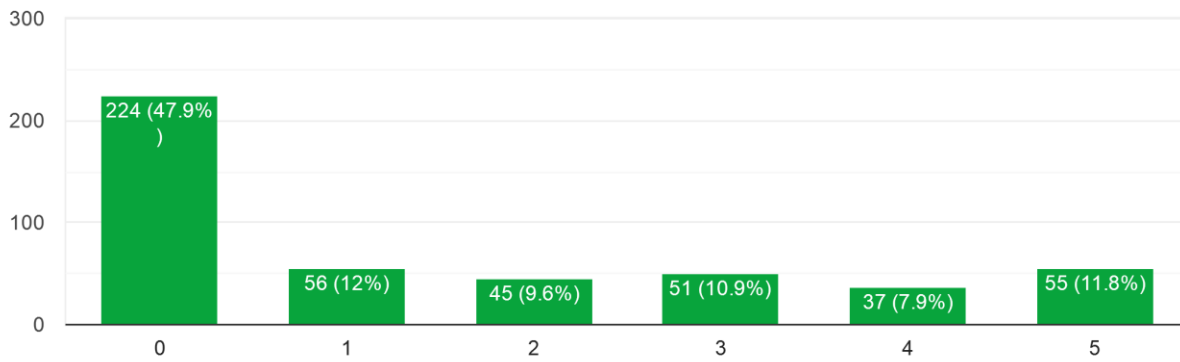
Leaf and grass clippings disposal

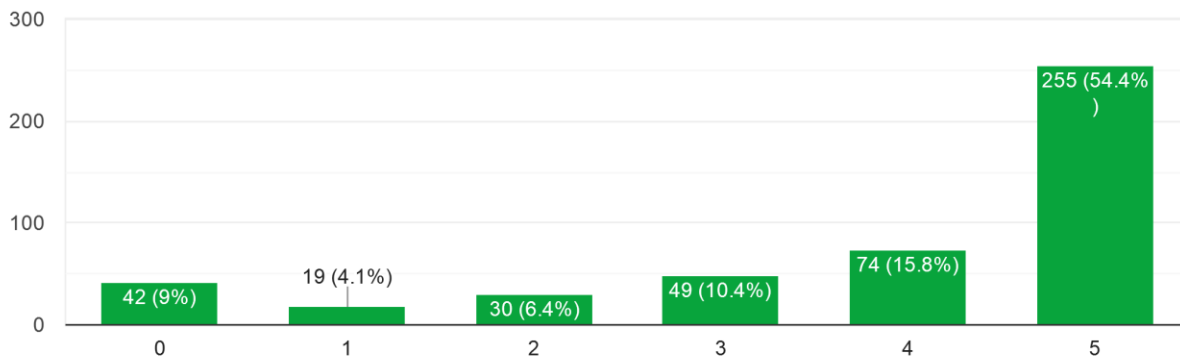

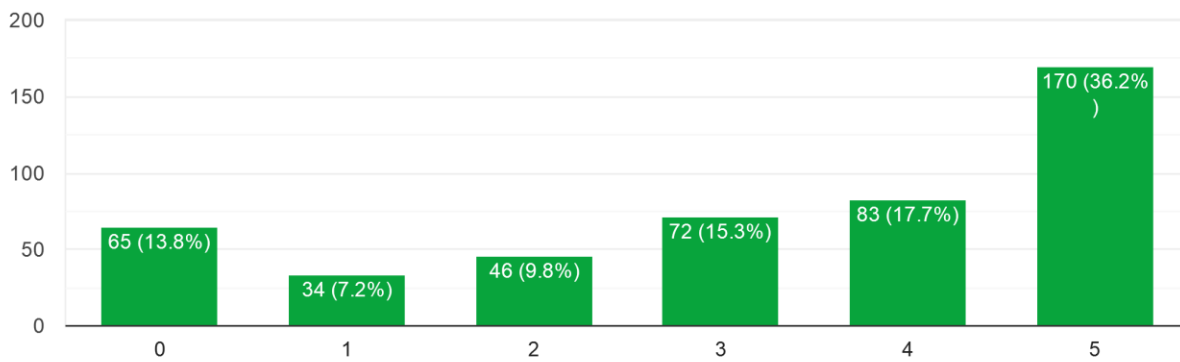
The "Store," where residents donate reusable household items for others to take for free

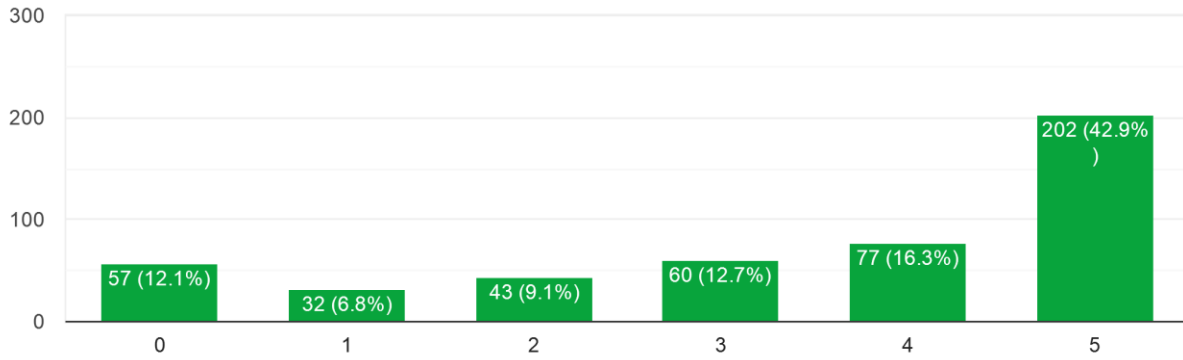
The books section of the Store, where residents donate books for others to claim

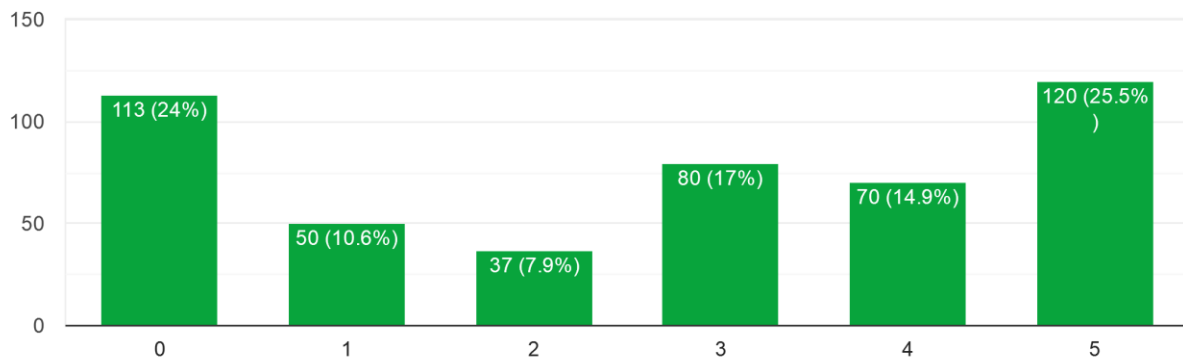
The “Clothing Exchange,” where residents donate clothing, linens, fabric, etc. that others can take for free

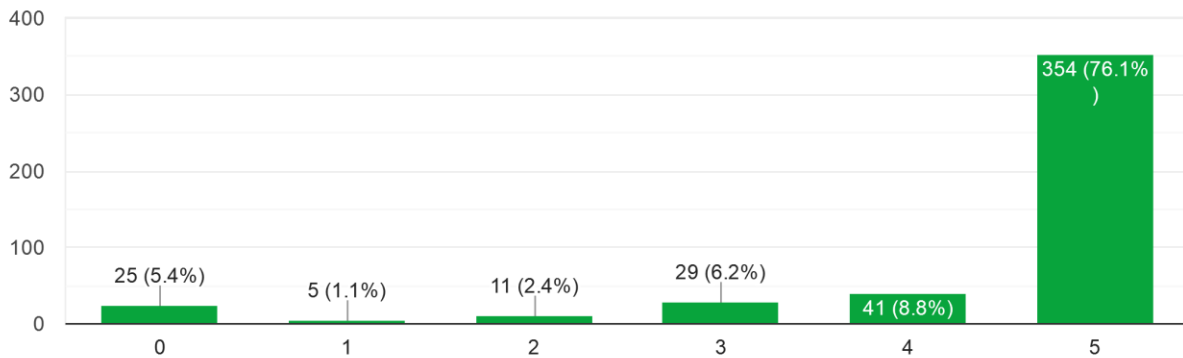
Returnable bottle collection, where the proceeds are donated to a charity.

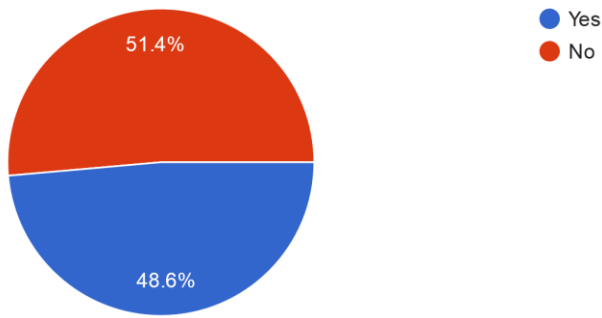
How important is it to have a town program to divert material from the waste stream by recycling and reusing?

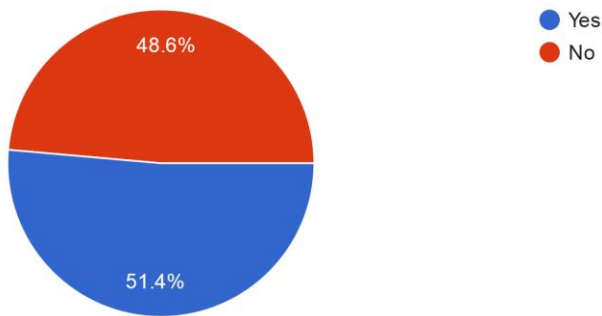
Would you be willing to pay a per-bag fee for curbside recycling collection?
